

Provide opportunities for your child to write for different purposes, such as making shopping lists, writing letters, or keeping a journal. Encourage creativity and praise their efforts to foster confidence in their writing abilities.

Look for everyday math opportunities, such as measuring ingredients while cooking, counting money, or estimating distances. This practical approach to learning math helps your child see its relevance in daily life and makes learning enjoyable.
