1. Kate Bird

She is teaching out of Room 5 (Year 2) and has a passion for working with junior school learners. She joins the Pātiki house (Kowhai) at our school and is a wonderful addition to our school community



2. Jazmyn Taipari

Whaea Jazmyn starts her teaching career here at Maungatapu School after obtaining her teaching qualification last year. We encourage children to be at school at around 8.30am which is when classrooms are open. We have noticed children being dropped of before 8am, which is too early! There's no staff supervision at this time of day.

Police urge parents & young people to be alert when

The New Zealand Police are urging parents to be alert to the potential risks facing children and young people online. For parents and caregivers:

- Supervision is essential. This means knowing what your children are doing online, who they are interacting with, and what platforms, apps, or games they are using.

Check privacy settings. We recommend parents and caregivers research and understand app settings, including privacy settings. This can include turning off location settings, setting profiles to private, or turning off chat functions.
Long term impact. Offenders will often use tactics such as fear or shame to manipulate young people, and make them feel alienated or trapped, like they cannot escape the situation. These situations can be very distressing and can have long term impacts and need to be addressed appropriately.
